BEACH SOCCER WORLD CUP ITALY VS. USA IN THE OPENING MATCH IN DUBAI ON THURSDAY

In the United Arab Emirates, the 12th edition of the FIFA World Cup begins: the Azzurri open the tournament (RaiSport 12:30).

■ Three days until the start of the **FIFA Beach Soccer World Cup**, scheduled in Dubai from February 15th to 25th: among the 16 contenders, Italy is also present, returning to the World Cup after missing the 2021 tournament.

Placed in Group A, they will face the United States in the tournament's opening match on Thursday, February 15th (12:30 pm live on RaiSport), then Egypt (on the 17th at the same time, live on RaiPlay), and on the 19th, the third group match against the host United Arab Emirates (4:30 pm, RaiSport).

THE ITALIAN NATIONAL TEAM. Led by coach Emiliano Del Duca, reached the United Arab Emirates recently, after initial preparations at the CPO in Tirrenia and a second phase in Muscat, Oman, where they played friendly matches against Saudi Arabia (5-3 win) and Oman (two losses, 4-5 and 2-3). These matches were decisive for the final squad selection, with Del Duca announcing the 12-player list for the World Cup on February 4th, aiming for a mix of experience (including Carpita, Gentilin, and Zurlo, veterans from the 2019 second-place finish) and youth (such as Bertacca and Fazzini born in 2001), leaving out Paterniti, Shalabi, Sassari, and Percia Montani who returned to Italy recently. Among the squad is Fabio Sciacca, who participated in the 2009 FIFA U-20 World Cup in Egypt, having made his Serie A debut with Catania. The selected players, all amateurs, mostly come from Tuscan clubs (5 out of 12, with 3 from Viareggio being the most represented, 1 from San Miniato and Pietrasanta), mainly playing in the Promotion league. During the summer, they compete in the Serie A of beach soccer: 5 with Farmaè Viareggio, 2 with Catania BS, and Alsa Lab Napoli.

After finalizing the squad, Italy had their last tests in Dubai last week against Colombia (lost 8-7 on penalties), Senegal (won 3-2), and Mexico (won 7-2). With preparations completed, Italy will have the honor of opening the World Cup against the United States on Thursday (February 15th, 12:30 pm); followed by matches against Egypt (February 17th, 12:30 pm) and host United Arab Emirates (February 19th, 4:30 pm).

TV. All matches of the FIFA Beach Soccer World Cup will be broadcasted on the RaiSport channel and RaiPlay, with commentary by Lucio Michieli.

FIFA BEACH SOCCER WORLD CUP. This edition in Dubai marks the 12th FIFA Beach Soccer World Cup, 11 years after the 2013 edition also held in the United Arab Emirates. Sixteen teams have qualified: Argentina, Belarus, Brazil, Colombia, Egypt, Iran, Italy, Japan, Mexico, Oman, Portugal, Senegal, Tahiti, Ukraine, United Arab Emirates, and the USA. Brazil (5 titles), Russia (3), and Portugal (2) are the most successful teams in the competition and are also considered favorites this year.

ITALY'S AWARDS. Italy's Beach Soccer National Team was established in 2004 and was the first team assembled by a Federation in the previously "unofficial" circuit. In these 20 years, Italy has achieved two second place finishes in the World Cup in 2008 (lost to Brazil) and 2019 (lost to Portugal), as well as two fourth-place finishes. In the Euroleague, which is the European championship promoted by the BeachSoccerWorldWide circuit (UEFA has not yet established an official tournament), Italy has won three times (in 2005, 2018, and 2023), with one second-place finish (2010) and three third-place finishes (2009, 2012, and 2017).



THE SQUAD / THE 12 AZZURRI

THREE "VETERANS" OF 2ND PLACE 2019, BERTACCA AND FAZZINI THE YOUNGEST

CARPITA, GENTILIN AND ZURLO WERE IN PARAGUAY. GIORDANI AND CASAPIERI, POSSIBLE PROTAGONISTS. SCIACCA WAS AT THE UNDER-20 WORLD CUP

■ Starting with 16 and reducing to the 12 officially listed for FIFA, the Azzurri approach the World Cup almost as if it were their first time. Only Andrea Carpita, Josep Gentilin, and Emmanuele Zurlo have previously played in the World Cup. The Viareggio goalkeeper and the Brazilian-born defender (both in 2019 in Paraguay), while the captain has been part of three expeditions (Portugal 2015, Bahamas 2017, and Paraguay 2019). The three veterans, who won silver in Asunción five years ago, will have to lead a new and very young group. All the other players, in fact, are making their debut in the competition, starting with the two stars of Del Duca, Leandro Casapieri, elected best goalkeeper of the last European Championship, and Marco Giordani, acclaimed by the public as the best player of the same competition after an extraordinary hattrick in the final in Alghero against Spain.

THE YOUNGSTERS. It will also be a debut for the two Viareggio beach soccer jewels. Tommaso Fazzini, nicknamed "the prince", born in 2001 with pure talent, is the older brother of Jacopo, already a U21 National Team player and Empoli footballer. Luca Bertacca, also born in 2001, is a defender with overwhelming physicality, elected best young beach soccer player in the world in November 2022, ready to compete with the big names in the discipline. Special mention to Fabio Sciacca, who has already played in a World Cup, but in 11-a-side football: in 2009, after making his Serie A debut with Catania under Zenga, Francesco Rocca took him to the U-20 World Cup in Equpt. THE STAFF. Some have even participated in 8 World Cups, like Delegation Head Ferdinando Arcopinto, who was also present in the last unofficial World Cup in 2004. It's the third time in the dugout, the second as head coach (he was Massimo Agostini's assistant in 2017) for coach Emiliano Del Duca, one of the most successful in the Serie A of beach soccer with Terracina (2003 -2016) and then co-opted into the Italian staff since 2018. He has two EBSL European titles and a World Cup runner-up title to his name. Then there are two old acquaintances of beach soccer serving as assistants: Simone Feudi and Michele Leghissa, who have played 5 World Cups each.

PREVIOUS ENCOUNTERS WITH GROUP OPPONENTS

WITH THE USA ONLY THE CHALLENGE OF 2004, NEGATIVE BALANCE WITH EGYPT AND THE UAE

In terms of previous encounters, the Azzurri have played 6 matches against the three group opponents. With the USA, the only confrontation dates back to 2004, the debut season of the Italian National Team in the discipline: in the Mundialito in Portimao, it ended 3-1. With Egypt, one victory, that in the Final at the 2016 Mediterranean Games in Pescara (5-1), and two defeats at the Intercontinental Cup in Dubai in 2019 (4-6 aet) and at the more recent Mediterranean Games 2023 in Heraklion, Greece (2-3). With the United Arab Emirates, finally, a loss (4-6 aet) also at the Intercontinental Cup in Dubai in 2019.



EMILIANO DEL DUCA Head Coach

Terracinese, 50 years old, UEFA A coach, led Terracina BS from 2003 to 2016 winning 3 Scudetti, 3 Italian Cups, 3 Super Cups (in 2011 hat-trick). In 2018 he took charge of the national team, bringing the Azzurri back to the top of Europe twice (2018 and 2023) and coming close to the World Cup (2nd in 2019). He was awarded the "Golden Bench" for Beach Soccer in 2023 by the Technical Sector.

MICHELE LEGHISSA Assistant Coach

Michele Leghissa, born and bred in Friuli, is the Italian to have won the most European Championships: 1 on the pitch in 2005, 2 on the coaching staff (2018 and 2023). As a player, he made his debut for the national team in August 2004 for the Mundialito of Figueira da Foz in Portugal. He played 5 World Cups, boasting 2 second places between the field and the bench. Since 2009 he has also been the captain of the Azzurri.





FERDINANDO ARCOPINTO Head of Delegation

A long-time sports manager, 64 years old, he started in 1995 with Casertana, with whom he won promotion to Serie C. He then moved on to the cadres of the LND and the FIGC. Graduated in Marketing Management at "The Constantinian University – Cranston" in Rhode Islands in the USA, he has dedicated his professional life to beach soccer. In his career he has participated in 20 European Championships, 11 World Championships, 3 European Games, 3 Mediterranean Games, as well as 4 Mundialiti and 5 Eurocup.

SIMONE FEUDI Assistant Coach

Nicknamed "the Baron", he was captain of the national team, as well as the flag of Terracina with whom he won everything. He is considered one of the 10 strongest Italian players ever, In his career he boasts 3 league titles, 3 Italian Cups, 3 Super Cups, 5 participations in the World Cup (including 2nd place in 2008), 2 European Championships, as a player in 2005 and as an assistant in 2023.



LUCA BOSSI Athletic trainer

Born in '78, graduated from the Alma Mater Studiorum in Bologna, former athletic trainer of Triestina in Serie C and for 10 years of the National Referees Hub, he has been collaborating with the football federation since August 2021.



DANIELE DELRE Doctor

Born in '94, graduated in Medicine and Surgery, specializing in Sports Medicine, since November 2021 he has been collaborating with FIGC. With the Azzurri of the beach at the FIFA Qualifiers and the 2023 European Championship.

AGOSTINO POMPEANO Kit Manager

Born on 07/06/1991, he has been collaborating with the FIGC since 2020. Since 2022 he has been the Kit Manager of the national beach soccer team. He took part in 2 Euroleague European Finals in this role; he is at his first World Cup.



ANTONINO NOSDEO Goalkeepers trainer

Born in 70, ISEF graduate, coach with UEFA A qualification, since 2014 he has been collaborating with the FIGC as a goalkeeper coach. In his career, 4 World Championships and 6 European Championships. Head of the youth team of Ascoli Calcio.

FABIO CALIENDO Physio

Born on 22/08/1978, graduated in Sports Science with a diploma in massage physiotherapy, he has been collaborating with the staff of the National Teams since 2019: with beach soccer he has participated in 2 World Cups and 3 European

MATTEO SANTI Media Officer

Born on 10/12/1988, journalist, he has been at the FIGC press office since 2019, after working in the same unit of the 5-a-side Football Division (LND). He participated in Euro Futsal 2022 and Euro Futsal U19 2023.



ALVISE CLARIONI Doctor

Born in 1960, he graduated from La Sapienza University and boasts 2 specializations (emergency surgery and orthopedics). With the NT's since 2012. in the BS team he has participated in 3 World Cups and 9 European Championships.

SABRINA FILACCHIONE Team secretary

Born in '63, with the national teams since 1991. She has taken part in World and European Championships, Olympics and the main FIFA/UEFA tournaments. Since 2019 he has been the Secretary of the Beach Soccer NT.

FABIO FERAPPI Team secretary

Since 2000 he has been at Club Italia: Secretary of the Women's National Team, several Youth Teams, the University Academy, the Women's Beach Soccer. He has participated in Universiade, Olympics, Under-20 World Cup and Beach Soccer.

BRAZIL – PORTUGAL, FACE OFF IN THE FIRST ROUND

THE 2 QUEENS OF THE WORLD (7 TITLES TOGETHER) CLASH IN THE FIRST GAME OF GROUP B.

At the 12th FIFA Beach Soccer World Cup, 16 teams will participate: Argentina, Belarus, Brazil, Colombia, Egypt, Iran, Italy, Japan, Mexico, Oman, Portugal, Senegal, Tahiti, Ukraine, United Arab Emirates, USA. The first phase (February 15-20) will be played through four groups of four teams: three points for a win in regular time, two points for a win in extra time, and one point for a win in a penalty shootout.

The top two teams from each group will advance to the knockout stage: quarterfinals (February 22), semi-finals (February 24), third-place playoff, and the final (February 25).



In addition to the group of the Azzurri, who will have to deal mainly with Egypt, faced twice in the last 5 years in closely contested matches (4-3 victory in 2019, 3-2 defeat in the last Mediterranean Games), great attention is around Group B, which Italy, if they advance to the guarter – finals, could face.

Iran, Tahiti, Spain, and Argentina will play for the two spots in the knockout stage. On Friday 16, it will be the turn of Group C and D. In the first, Japan – which can boast the star Ozu Moreira, also a protagonist in the Beach Soccer championship. Always a forge of great Italian talents (players like Gori and Bertacca emerged there), Viareggio will face Belarus and Senegal a step ahead of Senegal and Colombia. The same goes for Group D, which has Brazil and USA.

THE 2025 EDITION

In one year, the World Cup in Africa: Seychelles appointment

The 2025 World Cup, marking the 20th anniversary of the tournament that began in Rio de Janeiro in 2005, will take place in Victoria, on the island of Mahé (Seychelles), from May 1st to 11th, 2025. It will be the first time the tournament is held in Africa, the last continent to host the event, completing the tour of all 6 confederations (4 times in UEFA countries, 4 times in CONMEBOL, once in AFC, Concacaf, and OFC). Seychelles will participate for the first time in the FIFA Beach Soccer World Cup, along with 4 UEFA teams, 3 each from AFC and CONMEBOL, 2 each from CAF and Concacaf, and 1 from OFC.

FROM VIAREGGIO TO DUBAI

Teammates in italian Serie A, opponents at the World Cup

The 2023 championship title belongs to Viareggio Beach Soccer. Always a breeding ground for great talents (players like Gori and Ramacciotti have grown there, legends also in the National Team), it provides the National Team with 5 players: goalkeeper Carpita, the 2001-born Bertacca and Fazzini, and the more experienced Genovali and Remedi. But at the World Cup, there will be other protagonists from the Viareggio championship: Japanese Ozu Moreira, Portuguese Leo Martins, and Brazilian superstar Zé Lucas. FIFA BEACH SOCCER WORLD CUP / HISTORY

FROM 2005, 4 TEAMS HAVE WON: FRANCE, BRAZIL, RUSSIA AND PORTUGAL

ONLY BRAZIL AND JAPAN HAVE BEEN PRESENT IN ALL 11 EDITIONS. PORTUGUESE MADJER HAS DOMINATED INDIVIDUAL RANKINGS.

■ The FIFA Beach Soccer World Cup Dubai 2024 is the 12th edition of the tournament, a part of the football family since 2005. It was first held for three years on the beaches of Rio de Janeiro, where from 1995 to 2004, 10 editions of a non-official World Cup (Beach Soccer World Championship) took place (9 victories for Brazil, 1 for Portugal). Since 2008, the FIFA Beach Soccer World Cup has left Brazil and moved across different Confederations: from Marseille (France) to Dubai (United Arab Emirates), from Ravenna (Italy) to Papeete (Tahiti), from Espinho (Portugal) to Nassau (Bahamas), from Luque (Paraguay) to Moscow (Russia). After annual editions between 2005 and 2009, the tournament became biennial.

TEAM RECORDS. So far, only 4 teams have lifted the trophy: Brazil with 5 titles (plus two second places and one third place), followed by Russia (3 titles, plus one third place), Portugal (2 titles, plus one second place and three third place), and France (1 title, in 2005). Spain, Italy, Tahiti, Uruguay, Switzerland, Japan, Mexico, and Iran have podium finishes without winning the tournament. Brazil and Japan are the only two teams always present, participating in all 11 editions from 2005 to date, reaching 12/12 in Dubai. Portugal, on the other hand, will reach 11 tournaments and holds the largest victory in the history of the World Cup, 14-2 against the Solomon Islands in 2006. Brazil holds the longest winning streak: 30 consecutive victories from the 11-2 win in the third-place match in 2005 (when they lost on penalties to Portugal, who were then defeated in the final by France) to the 8-12 loss in the final to Russia in 2011, the first defeat in regulation time for Brazil in World Cup history.

INDIVIDUAL RECORDS. Regarding individual records, Brazilian goalkeeper Mao has the most appearances in the tournament (52), followed by Madjer (49), who is the symbol of the World Cup, having won 11 awards: 2 times Best Player (Golden Ball), 2 times second (Silver Ball), and 1 time third (Bronze Ball); 3 times top scorer (Golden Scorers) and 3 times second (Silver Scorers). The Portuguese star also holds the record for goals in a tournament: 21 in 2006; behind him is Italian Gabriele Gori (17 in 2017). Gori is the most awarded Italian player at the World Cup: Top Scorer (Golden Scorer) in 2017 and 2019; only one other Italian, Emanuele Zurlo, has received awards at the World Cup, finishing second behind Gori in 2017 (Silver Scorer), as well as receiving the award for the tournament's best goal (the first for Switzerland).

Dutchman Roel Liefden was the oldest player to participate in the World Cup: 46 years and 216 days in 2013; and among others on the field with him was his son Diego (23 years old). The youngest players are two fifteen-year-olds, Erasmus Ndlovu (South Africa 2005) and Abu Azeez (Nigeria 2009). The fastest goal came after 2 seconds, and 4 players share the record: Buru (Brazil) and Madjer (Portugal) in 2009, Pachev (Ukraine) in 2011, Torres (Spain) in 2017.

ITALY AT THE WORLD CUP / HISTORY

AZZURRI TWICE A STEP AWAY FROM TRIUMPH

IN 2008 AND 2019, THE TWO DEFEATS IN THE FINAL. IN 2005. THE PLAYOFF DISAPPOINTMENT. IN 2011 IN RAVENNA THE GREAT LETDOWN.

In Dubai, Italy will reach their ninth participation in the FIFA Beach Soccer World Cup, five of which were consecutive between 2006 and 2011: behind Brazil, Japan (13), and Portugal (11), the Azzurri are among the teams with the most appearances in the Final Phase of the competition. In addition to the 2nd place achieved in 2008 in Marseille (France) and in 2019 in Luque (Paraguay), Italy also finished in the top 4 in 2015 and 2017 (4th place in both editions). Italy has missed the World Cup only on three occasions: in 2005, 2013, and 2021.


Italy's history at the FIFA World Cup began in 2005, or rather, did not fully begin. In the first World Cup, Italy reached Rio de Janeiro, but only with the certainty of participating in the playoff for the last available European spot. To assign the 4 UEFA spots, a somewhat questionable regulation was enacted: FIFA considered the top 3 from the European tournament (EBSL), namely France, Portugal, and Ukraine, while Italy, which finished fourth, was forced to face a four-team playoff with Spain (a global powerhouse but finished 5th in Europe), Switzerland, and Austria. After defeating Austria in the semifinals, the beach soccer National Team's journey was halted by the Red Furies led by the acrobat Amarelle, who thus entered among the 16 qualified National Teams. While the tournament began, the Azzurri were already bitterly on their way back home.

A year later, in November 2006, the Azzurri made their official debut at the World Cup, but the outcome was disastrous: 3 defeats in 3 matches against Bahrain, Nigeria, and Argentina. The first victory would come in the following edition, in 2007, the last one in Copacabana: on November 3, 6-3 against Japan, a victory that did not avoid the second elimination in the group stage due to losses against Uruguay and Senegal. When the World Cup left Copacabana, Italy began to dream in 2008 on the Prado beach in Marseille, the Azzurri eliminated the host country France led by Eric Cantona, then the eternal rival Spain, surrendering only to the Brazilian phenomena in the final (5-3). After the guarter-final elimination in Dubai in 2009, at the hands of Brazil, in 2011 came the biggest disappointment: the tournament at home, in Ravenna, but the great ambitions of the eve, grown after 3 successes in the group, clashed against a modest El Salvador in the quarterfinals.

Following the failure at the Qualifier for 2013 and then the great rebirth: a new Italy is a protagonist in Espinho 2015 and Nassau 2017, but in both tournaments stops in the semi-finals (many regrets especially for the defeat against Tahiti in Portugal). In 2019, in Lugue, Paraguay, the Azzurri achieve the feat: Russia beaten in the semi-finals 8-7 and entrance in the final with Portugal. Dreams of glory, however, again postponed, after a very balanced game, the Portuguese pull ahead and close 6-4.

Absent in 2021 in Moscow, Italy secured the pass for the World Cup in the United Arab Emirates (the first country to repeat the tournament's organization after Brazil) at the FIFA QUALIFIER in Baku (Azerbaijan).

FIFA WORLD CUP: EURO OUALIFIERS

The European national teams faced off in Azerbaijan from July 2nd to July 9th, 2023: Belarus, Italy, Portugal, and Ukraine secured their tickets to Dubai. After the initial phase (four groups of four teams each), the top two from each group clashed in the quarterfinals, matches valid for the World Cup: France, Spain, Denmark, and Moldova were defeated. The Azzurri sealed a 4-3 victory in extra time against Spain, who had come back from 1-3 to 3-3 in the third period. The extra time was decided by Emmanuele Zurlo's acrobatic shot. Then Spain was reinstated due to Ukraine's withdrawal.

AZZURRI's NUMBERS

Gori, the king of strikers: Golden scorer in '17 e '19

For the first time Palmaci will not be with the Azzurri at the World Cup: he played 38 matches, in 8 editions In its 8 participations in the World Cup, Italy has played 38 matches: 22 wins and 16 losses, with a goal difference of +32 (178/146). Throughout the 38 matches, there's been one constant: Paolo Palmacci, always in the squad from 2006 to 2019: 8 World Cups, 38 appearances, scoring 27 goals, placing him 2nd in the list of top scorers. Ahead of him is Gabriele Gori, with 41 goals in 4 editions, Golden Scorer in 2017 and 2019. Third among the top scorers is Roberto Pasquali (20), who scored Italy's first goal at the FIFA World Cup in 2006; followed by Emmanuele Zurlo (19). Gori also holds the record for most goals in a single match: 5 against Mexico in 2019; Palmacci and Pasquali reached 4 (against El Salvador in 2011 and Brazil in 2009). In terms of World Cup appearances, behind Palmacci with 8, is Corosiniti (7 tournaments from 2006 to 2017), who is also second in number of appearances (35), followed by Feudi, Leghissa, and Pasquali (5 between 2006 and 2011). **BEACH SOCCER ITALY NT / HISTORY**

February 29, 2004: The newly established Italian Beach Soccer National Team makes its debut in Rio de Janeiro with a 3-2 victory over France. Goals scored by Galli, Agosto, and Fruzzetti. In the last unofficial World Cup, Italy finished fourth.

The Italian Beach Soccer National Team has been at the forefront of the sport for several years. Established in 2004 under the auspices of the National Amateur League (the first federation to recognize the discipline), it later became part of Club Italia, fully integrating into the National Team family. In the Italian team's palmares, there are two second place finishes at the FIFA World Cup in 2008 (defeated by Brazil) and 2018 (defeated by Portugal), as well as three European Championship titles (in 2005, 2018, and 2023), one second place (in 2010), and three third places (in 2009, 2012, and 2017).

From 2004 to the present day, six Head Coaches have alternated on the Italian bench: Pedro Pablo Pasculli in 2004, Massimo Agostini from 2005 to 2006, Fausto Silipo for a brief period in 2006, Giancarlo Magrini from 2006 to 2010, Massimiliano Esposito from 2010 to 2015, Massimo Agostini again from 2015 to 2017, and currently Emiliano Del Duca, in office since September 2018.

VICTORIES. In 2005, Italy clinched their first European title in Marseille, defeating Portugal on penalties after an incredible comeback in the final period. In 2015, they won gold at the "Mediterranean Beach Games" in Pescara (and a couple of months later, a silver medal at the European Olympic Games in Baku). The second triumph came in September 2018 in Alghero: Italy became European Champions for the second time by defeating Spain in the final on penalties. Again in Alghero, in September 2023, Italy achieved their third Euroleague triumph: after defeating Portugal, eight-time European champions, in the semifinals, they overcame Spain in the final with the same outcome as in 2018, 5-4. For Italy, there were also two individual awards: Marco Giordani was named the tournament's best player with 3 goals in the final, and Casapieri was awarded best goalkeeper.

For Coach Del Duca, it was his second title leading the team, while for assistant coach Michele Leghissa, it was his third, having also won as a player in 2005.

THE WOMEN'S NATIONAL TEAM

The rapid rise of the Azzurre

The Women's Beach Soccer National Team is the newest addition to the Azzurre National Teams. It held its first training camp in October 2021 and made its debut in a European competition on June 1, 2022, when it defeated Spain 3-2 on the beach in Nazaré in a match valid for the Women's EuroLeague. In that year's European finals, the girls of Del Duca had a great run, reaching the final but ultimately losing 2-0 to Spain. In the 2023 edition of the EBSL Superfinal, Italy finished 5th, defeating Ukraine in the playoff match. This result allowed the Azzurre to climb positions in the European ranking, rising to 6th place.

YOUTH ACTIVITY

Since 2022, Under 17 & 15 tournaments have been organized

The Youth and School Sector, which established the Technical Commission for Youth Beach Soccer in 2022, promotes beach soccer activity for youth categories, with the aim of facilitating the development of beach soccer in Italy by fostering a system rooted at the top, both in terms of National Teams and club competitions. In the summer of 2022, Under 18 and Under 15 tournaments were organized for the first time. In the 2023 season, Under 17 and Under 15 tournaments were held. Alongside the tournaments, courses dedicated to coaches and managers have been launched. So far, 28 Beach Soccer Coaches have been qualified with an A License, 24 with a B License, and 224 with a UEFA Grassroots E License.

CLUB ACTIVITY

Serie A and other competitions

The 2023 Serie A championship belongs to Viareggio Beach Soccer. The city of Versilia has always been a breeding ground for great talents (players like Gori and Ramacciotti, legends also in the National Team, grew up there) thanks to the famous "muretto" and the "Matteo Valenti" tournament, a highly anticipated event in the area. In addition to the Coppa Italia (held by Catania) and the Supercoppa (won by Pisa), the LND also organizes women's competitions (with Lady Terracina winning the tricolor, Cagliari winning the coccarda, and Genova BS winning the Supercoppa), as well as the Under 20 championship and cup, both won by Farmaè Viareggio.
